Not only is the acquisition of such images technically difficult, but the resulting evidence must stand up to a rigorous legal process to be accepted by a Court as proof.

CONTENT

- ▶ The law relating to photographic evidence, observation points and disclosure rules as defined by the Regulation of Investigatory Powers Act, the Criminal Procedure and Investigations Act and the Human Rights Act
- ▶ How and when to take and produce evidentially acceptable photographs and videos
- ▶ The production of photographic evidence as exhibits during interviews and court proceedings
- ▶ The planning, selection and operation of observation points
- ▶ The use of the pocket book to ensure continuity of evidence
- ▶ Defines the difference between recognition and identification when using photographic evidence.
